All Generators, regardless of Fuel Type, can produce Deadly Carbon Monoxide

Carbon Monoxide Poisoning can be deadly. Be certain that Carbon Monoxide Detectors are properly installed and working before using any type of Generator.

- Start by reviewing your Owners Manuel. Most Generators have specific instructions for extended periods of use.
- Have maintenance supplies on hand for extended periods of use: extra oil, filters, etc.
- Have a 'GENERATOR DAY". Set up and run your Generator for several hours providing power to your house. The normal weekly test run checks the Generator System for proper operation but does not actually power your house.
- If your Generator is powered by propane, gasoline or diesel fuel, try to calculate your fuel consumption. This may help in determining how much and how often you may need to get fuel during extended outages.
- Most Generators recommend a period of shut down each day. Maybe running only 20 out of 24 hours. Check your Owners Manuel for specific instructions.
